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

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1. BACKGROUND

1.1 ESTABLISHMENT

The Ministry of Human Resource Development, Govt. of India decided to set up 20 IIITs in PPP mode as part of the Twelfth Plan. An expert Committee, under the chairmanship of Mr. T. Mohandas Pai was formed. This committee laid down the broad criteria under which industry partners would be chosen and the criteria for accepting proposals from States. It also laid down the expectations from industry partners and how another category of participants, donors, could be involved with an IIIT. A Workshop was then held on March 18, 2011 at IIT Delhi with participation from representatives of different possible stake holders in such a scheme. This workshop provided inputs for the Expert Committee to consider while finalizing their report. Following the submission of the report by the expert committee, a National Steering Committee (NSC) was formed with Secretary MHRD as its Chairman, to oversee the establishment of these IIITs. The NSC approved the format of an MoU to be signed between the Central Govt., the concerned State Govt., and the industry partners for the particular IIIT. It also approved the MOA for the establishment of a Society for each IIIT and the Rules to be followed by each IIIT.

1.2 STATE STEERING COMMITTEE

One of the requirements in the process of establishment was the formation of a State Steering Committee (SSC) and the SSC for IIIT Guwahati was formed by the Govt. of Assam on September 30, 2011 and the Institute was named as Indian Institute of Information Technology and Advanced Science (IIITAS). The suffix "AS" was dropped once the MoU and MoA approved by the Central Government required each Institute to be named IIIT XXX, where XXX is the place of establishment of the IIIT. The SSC met for four times before the establishment of the Institute, and once after that. The order forming the SSC and the minutes of the meetings of the SSC are given in Appendix A. The major decisions taken in these meetings were as follows.

First Meeting (21/11/2011) -

- Addition of 8 more eminent persons to the SSC.
- Approval of Industry Partners: Tata Group, Oil India, Amtron.

- Approved that proposal to establish IITAS and a DPR for the project will be submitted to Govt. of India.
- Approval of Amtron to act as the Secretariat till the Director is appointed.
- Approval for starting classes from August 2012 subject to approval of the project from Govt. of India.

Second Meeting (21/07/2012) -

- Noted that the Govt. of India has approved the establishment of an IIIT at the land identified by the Govt. of Assam at village Bongora near the Guwahati airport.
- A sub-committee formed to handle land acquisition matters.
- Commissioner Higher Education to take up the matter for appointing an interim Director
- Approval to the Registration of the Society for IIIT Guwahati.

Third Meeting (04/12/2012) -

- Noted the appointment of Prof Rajeev Sangal Director IIIT Hyderabad as Interim / Mentor Director of IIIT Guwahati.
- Noted that land acquisition process has been started by Deputy Commissioner Kamrup.
- Approval given for the establishment of IIIT Guwahati in temporary premises at the campus of Assam Conductors Ltd where 34,000 sq ft of built up space is available.
- Noted the approval given by the Chairman for advertisement of 10 posts of Lecturers
- Approved the MoA and MoU for the Institute, sent by MHRD, Govt. of India

Fourth Meeting (06/05/2013) -

Noted the final list of Industry Partners: Tata Consultancy Services, Oil India Ltd, eMedhassu Ltd., Novatium Ltd., Srei Finance Infrastructure, Amtron.

- IIT Guwahati appointed the Mentor Institute, and Director IIT Guwahati the Mentor Director
- MOU and MoA signed by all the parties.
- Admission related decisions

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- Admissions will be given for B. Tech degrees in two programmes, namely, Computer Science and Engineering (CSE), and Electronics and Communication Engineering (ECE).
 - 1. Each programme will admit 30 students.
 - 2. Reservations for OBC, SC, ST and PWD categories will be as per the provisions of the Central Education Institutes (CEI) Reservations Act.
 - 3. Fifty percent of the seats will be filled based on the JEE (Mains) all-India merit list, and fifty percent of the seats will be filled based on the JEE (Mains) Assam merit list. Mentor Director will inform the Central Board of JEE (Mains) of the above decisions once the Society is formed.
 - 4. The curriculum to be followed for the first semester will be the curriculum currently being followed at IIIT Hyderabad.
 - 5. The fees to be charged to the entrants will be the same as that charged to students of IIT Guwahati, except that SC and ST students will get a 20% waiver of the tuition fees. The Committee noted that the annual tuition fees will be ₹90,000/- and that, including other fees and refundable security deposits, about ₹60,000 will have to be paid in the first semester and about ₹52,000 in the second semester.
 - 6. Faculty to teach the first semester courses will include faculty deputed from IIT Guwahati, from State Colleges in Guwahati, and the trainee faculty already appointed and currently in IIIT Hyderabad.

1.3 DETAILED PROJECT REPORT

A detailed project report (DPR) was submitted by the State Govt. to the MHRD, Govt. of India in April 2012 as part of the requirements laid down by MHRD. The DPR identified the six industry partners. It identified the land allotted to the Institute. It also mapped the growth of the academic activities of the Institute, envisaging a total student strength of 1430 students by year 10. This will comprise 960 UG, 400 Masters, and 70 PhD students. Besides degree programmes, the Institute will have educational outreach programmes, industry collaboration, and innovation promotion. With a capital expenditure of ₹128 crores, the DPR projected creation of 49,000 sqm of built-up space comprising 10,000, 13,000, 25,000 and 800 sgm for the academic, residential, hostel and guest house infrastructure respectively. The cost per sqm was estimated to be ₹15,000, escalating to ₹35,000 in 10 years. There would be 75 faculty and 50 staff by the end of the tenth year.

2. MOA AND MOU OF IIIT **GUWAHATI SOCIETY**

The Indian Institute of Information Technology Guwahati Society was registered as a Society on July 6 2013. The Memorandum of Association of the Society and the First set of Rules are given in Appendix C. Prior to the registration of the society, a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) was signed by representatives of all the partners who are setting up the Institute. This too is given in Appendix C. The salient features of the MoU are;

The Govt. of India shall

- Contribute 57.5% of the total capital cost of ₹128.00 crores, over a period of time, for setting up of THE IIIT, including seed money to the extent of ₹10.00 crores that would be released by the Central Government during the first financial year of the inception of the
- ii) Provide partial financial support to the extent of ₹10.00 crore (Rupees Ten Crore) to THE IIIT towards recurring expenditure during the first four years of setting up THE IIIT, depending on actual year-wise requirement of THE IIIT; and
- iii) Provide funds under the Scheme for faculty development programme.
- iv) Shall establish a National Steering Committee (hereinafter called `THE NSC') which will be an Apex body for guiding the implementation and monitoring of THE SCHEME. The NSC shall have representatives of the Central Government, State Governments and Industry Partners of all the IIITs established under the Scheme.

The Govt. of Assam shall

Contribute 35% of the total capital cost of ₹128.00 crore, for setting up of THE IIIT.

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- Provide 50-100 acres of land, free of cost for setting up THE IIIT, duly registered in the name of the Society.
- iii) After signing of the MoU to forthwith have the Society registered under the relevant State Societies Registration Act.
- iv) Establish the State Steering Committee (SSC).

The industry partners shall

- Nominate its representative as members of THE BOARD.
- Contribute 7.5% of the total capital cost of Rs.128.00 crore, for setting up of THE IIIT. 50% of the money to be contributed by the Industry Partner(s) towards the scheme may be provided at the time of signing of the MoU in the form of an irrevocable Bank Guarantee in the name of the State Government from a Nationalized Bank by the Industry Partner(s). Once the MOA & Rules are framed and the IIIT is registered, the industry shall deposit in case 50% of its contribution in the name of the concerned IIIT. The remainder contribution would be made by the Industry Partner(s) depending upon the progress of the Scheme.
- iii) To contribute towards research labs and projects, internship, faculty chairs etc., from time to time, in furthering the objects of THE SCHEME.

The Board of Governors

- 1.0 The society will have a BOARD OF GOVERNORS (hereinafter called THE BOARD) for THE IIIT which would be the principal executive body of the Institute having adequate administrative and financial powers. It would be entrusted with the task of managing the affairs of THE IIIT. The composition of the Board, and its powers and functions etc. would be according to the terms and conditions spelt out in the Memorandum of Association and Rules and Regulations of the Society appended with this MoU.
- 1.1 However, the first chairperson of the Board shall be appointed by the Govt. of India in consultation with the State Govt. and the Industry partners. The other members of the First Board of Governors, who are to be co-opted by the Board, shall be appointed by the Central Government in consultation with the State Govt., the Industry partners and the Chairperson.

3. MENTOR INSTITUTE AND MENTOR DIRECTOR

Initially, IIIT Hyderabad was appointed the Mentor Institute and the Director of IIIT Hyderabad, the Mentor Director in the third meeting of the SSC in April 2012. However, due to the distance between Hyderabad and Guwahati, it became difficult for IIIT Hyderabad to provide enough support. Accordingly, in the 4th SSC meeting held in May 2013 approved the appointment of IIT Guwahati as the Mentor Institute and the IIT Guwahati Director as the Mentor Director. Subsequently, the Govt of Assam appointed IIT Guwahati as the Mentor Institute of IIIT Guwahati. The Director IIT Guwahati, Prof. Gautam Barua took over as the Mentor Director and started the operations of the Institute. He handed over charge as Director IIT Guwahati to Prof. Gautam Biswas on Septmeber 6 2013. Prof. Biswas appointed Prof. Gautam Barua as the Mentor Director of IIIT Guwahati. He was placed on secondment to IIIT Guwahati by the Board of IIT Guwahati.

4. ADMISSION OF STUDENTS AND COMMENCEMENT OF **CLASSES.**

As per the decision of the SSC, it was decided to admit 60 students, 30 each in CSE and ECE to the first year B. Tech programme of IIIT Guwahati. Admission was to be through JEE (Main). Even though the SSC had recommended a 50% quota for students from Assam, the Govt. of India did not agree to it as the NSC had decided that admissions would be based on an All-India merit. Admissions took place in July and August of 2013. After the centrally administered admissions were over, 9 seats remained vacant and spot admissions were held to fill up these seats. Students from Assam filled up these seats. As a result all 120 seats were filled up. Classes commenced, after a formal inauguration by the Chief Minister, on 26 August 2013.

The Institute started operations from a building of 2000 sgm area in the Assam Textile Institute campus. 16 flats were hired to house the students and lecturers appointed in December 2012. These lecturers had gone to IIIT Hyderabad for training and returned to take part in the academic programme of the Institute. Faculty from IIT

Guwahati taught the courses in the first two semesters. Three staff were seconded from IIT Guwahati to help with office work.

5. 5TH SSC DECISIONS

The fifth meeting of the State Steering Committee was held on December 11, 2013. The following decisions were taken by the SSC:

- 1. Approval granted for the recruitment of faculty at the Assistant Professor level, on contract (CSE 4, ECE 4, Mathematics 2, English 1, Economics 1)
- 2. Staff recruitment to be done after the Board is formed.

7. APPOINTMENT OF CHAIRMAN AND FORMATION OF THE BOARD OF GOVERNORS

As per the MoU, the first Chairman was to be appointed by MHRD in consultation with the State Govt. and industry partners. After due consultations, Mr. S. Ramadorai, Chairman, National Skill Development Agency, was appointed as the Chairman of the Board of Governors of IIIT Guwahati on 26th February 2014. Subsequently the Board was formed by MHRD on March 28, 2014 (appendix D). The first Board of the Institute was subsequently formed in April 2014 after nominees of

MINUTES OF THE SECOND MEETING OF THE NATIONAL STEERING COMMITTEE ON SETTING UP OF 20 NEW IIITS IN THE PPP MODE HELD ON 14TH MARCH 2012

The 2nd meeting of the National Steering Committee (NSC) for setting up of the 20 new IIITs in the PPP mode was held under the chairpersonship of Education Secretary on 14.3.2012 to review, monitor implementation and recommend for selection of proposals received from some of the State Governments regarding setting up of a new IIIT in their respective State for final approval of the Hon'ble Minister of Human Resource Development. The list of participants who attended the meeting is at Annexure.

- 2. The Education Secretary welcomed the participants and stated that it was heartening to witness such a large gathering which was a proof that the States, as is the Centre, were enthusiastic to implement the scheme for setting up of the new IIITs. The Chairperson stated that this meeting would enable the NSC to deliberate and recommend the proposals at hand for obtaining the final approval of the Hon'ble Human Resources Development Minister, for setting up of the first two or three new IIITs in the PPP mode in the country.
- 3. The Special Secretary (HE) opened the discussions by introducing the Agenda items one by one. He stated that the proposals of the State Government of Rajasthan, Madhya Pradesh and Himachal Pradesh were being placed for consideration / recommendation by the NSC. The proposals of the State Governments of Assam, Gujarat, Karnataka, Kerala and Tripura were essentially for review by the NSC, whereas the modalities of funding for the scheme and the proposed Draft tripartite Memorandum of Agreement / Understanding were being placed for consideration and approved by NSC. The constitution of the Site Selection Committee, Coordination Committee and identification of mentoring institutions were the other agenda items for consideration of the NSC.
- 4. The Principal Secretary, Technical Education, Government of Rajasthan made a detailed presentation on the proposal for establishment of a IIIT in Kota, Rajasthan. He mentioned that state has identified, namely, Genpact with a contribution of Rs.3.2 crore; C.K.Birla Group with a contribution of Rs.6.4 crore; Lakshmi & Mittal Foundation with a contribution of Rs.6.4 crore and Vakarangee Group with a contribution of Rs.3.2 crore. He expressed the confidence that IIIT Kota would reach a breakeven point in its fifth year of operation and would become self reliant there after. The Principal Secretary, T.E, Government of Rajasthan also mentioned that the State Govt. intends to start the academic programmes from 2012-13 for which it also has identified temporary premises.

However, the members of the NSC were of the view that the role of the industry partner defining its support and direction to the research in the institution, based on perceived future needs of the entire industry should be built into the structure so that there is total commitment from the industry. The scheme actually is looking for the industry partners whose commitment would be to help develop innovative products for the domestic market and make available exceptionally educated manpower for undertaking product development and doing applied research to enhance global competitiveness of the Indian industry.

Keeping this in view, the government of Rajasthan were requested to re-visit the proposal with its industry partners and submit the DPR clearly spelling out the commitment the industry partners would make, other than the investment of funds,




specifically indicating areas on which each industry partner would help the research and development capability in IT industry as well as domain areas like automobiles, healthcare, e-Governance etc. Accordingly, the commitment of the Industry partners needs to be embedded in the DPR of State Government. The proposed new IIIT at Kota would have to be registered as a Society under the Societies Registration Act 1860 as per the approved scheme.

The proposal of Government of Rajasthan was deliberated by the Members of the National Steering Committee and it was approved by all the members that the proposal of the Government of Rajasthan for setting of a new IIIT in not for profit PPP mode in Kota qualifies and meets the various requirements envisaged in the overall scheme for establishment of 20 new IIITs in PPP mode in the country. A subgroup as indicated at 21 (a) would look into the revised proposal. The National Steering Committee authorized the Sub-Group to take further action and recommend the case for approval of Hon'ble HRM.

Prof. Rajeev Sangal, Director, IIIT-Hyderabad was of the view that the 5. industry partner should bring in not only money but should also take active interest in contributing to the institution. The partner should pose real life problems faced in industry, which the institution can use to carry out research and come up with innovative solutions which can get into academic courses leading to innovative masters and dual-degree programs and enrichen teaching as well. The Academic Council should be able to lay down the social, academic, industry oriented curriculum design to ensure that such areas and disciplines which have relevance for society are also considered for competency building in the IIIT. Students who come out of such an academic environment will also be much more aware of industrial needs and practices and can think in a more holistic manner. They will, thus, be more employable as well as more suited to innovation. The industry partner can also offer specific funded projects and seek consultancy help from faculty of the institution. It can also take students as summer interns or as employees after they complete studies. This arrangement would be like any other company.

Prof. Sangal also pointed out that it was necessary that quality faculty development programmes is initiated, as envisaged under the scheme itself, in collaboration with identified lead institutions so that the scheme could achieve its aims and objects in optimal minimum time.

- 6. Shri Rajendra S. Pawar, Chairman & Co-founder, NIIT was of the view that the Board, the Chairman and the Directors need to be in place for establishment of any new IIIT and the area of focus of each new IIIT must be part of the proposal being prepared by the State Governments. The role of Governance is important and the sequence of Governance is equally important (e.g) the Board and Chairman should select the Director of the proposed IIIT.
- 7. The Secretary, Information Technology Department, Government of Madhya Pradesh made a presentation on the proposal for setting up a IIIT in Bhopal, Madhya Pradesh. He stated that three Industry Partners, namely, Core Education and Technologies Pvt Ltd., Trident Info Tech Ltd and Genpact have been identified by the State Government. He informed that the State Government has proposed two Investment patterns by the selected industry partners where 3 partners invest Rs. 19.2 crores as per the approved scheme, and in another the 3 partners would contribute Rs. 35.20 crores, the additional amount (Rs. 15.80 crore) being utilized for the establishment of R&D infrastructure. He also asserted that the IIIT, Bhopal would reach a breakeven point in its fifth year of operation and would




As in the case of Rajasthan, the NSC requested the Government of Madhya Pradesh also to re-visit each of the proposals of the Industry partner so as to incorporate the commitments of the industry partners in the DPR indicating clearly areas on which each industry partner would help the research and development capability in IT industry as well as in the domain areas of its operations. It was agreed by the NSC that the additional amount of Rs. 15.80 crores from the Industry partners would be utilized for the establishment of R&D infrastructure at IIIT, Bhopal. The proposal of Government of Madhya Pradesh was deliberated by the Members of the National Steering Committee and it was approved by all the members that the proposal of the Government of Madhya Pradesh for setting of a new IIIT in not for profit PPP mode in Bhopal qualifies and meets the various requirements envisaged in the overall scheme for establishment of 20 new IIITs in PPP mode in the country. The sub-group would scrutinize the modified proposal of the Government of Madhya Pradesh and take further action to recommend the case for approval of Hon'ble HRM.

8. The Joint Director, Department of Technical Education, Government of Himachal Pradesh made a presentation on the proposal for setting an IIIT in Una, Himachal Pradesh. He mentioned that the State Government is committed to provide land measuring 132 acres free of cost in district Una alongwith the 35% state share. Three industry partners, have since been selected, namely, H.P.Power producer Forum, Himachal Drug Manufactures Association and B.B.N. Industries Association (Redg.), Himachal Pradesh. IIIT, Una will be registered under the Societies Registration Act, 1860. IIT, Mandi has been identified as the mentoring institution for IIIT Una.

The NSC requested the Government of Himachal Pradesh to formalize its DPR indicating both the breakup of the proposed investment by each of the Industry partners and the commitments indicating areas on which each industry partner would help the research and development capability in IT industry as well as in the domain areas of its operations. The proposal of Government of Himachal Pradesh was deliberated by the Members of the National Steering Committee and it was approved by all the members that the proposal of the Government of Himachal Pradesh for setting of a new IIIT in not for profit PPP mode in Una qualifies and meets the various requirements envisaged in the overall scheme for establishment of 20 new IIITs in PPP mode in the country. The sub-group would scrutinize the proposal of the Government of Himachal Pradesh and take further action to recommend the case for approval of Hon'ble HRM.

9. The Managing Director, AMTRON, Government of Assam made a presentation on the proposal for setting up a IIIT in Guwahati, Assam and informed that the Industry partners proposed are; (i) TATA Group as the Private Industry Partnership; (ii) Oil India Ltd as Industry partner, being a Central Public Sector Undertaking; (iii) AMTRON, the state nodal IT agency as an Industry partner, being a State Public Sector Undertaking. It was submitted that the state will submit its DPR by the end of March, 2012. The NSC clarified to the Govt. of Assam that under the scheme the requirement was that the identified Industry partner would be from Private Sector and therefore any Public Sector Undertaking (PSU) does not qualify as per the scheme. The representative of the State Government clarified that it



- 10. The representative of Government of Gujarat stated that the Government of Gujarat had identified 78 acres of land in Vadodara and the State Government is negotiating for selection of private partners.
- 11. The representative of Government of Karnataka had indicated that the State had identified 50 acres of land in the campus of Karnataka University, Dharwar for setting up of a IIIT in Karnataka. The Government is the process of identifying the Industry partners for which letters of support has been received from 12 Industries. It was stated that the State would submit its DPR at the earliest.
- 12. The representative of Government of Kerala indicated that 50 acres of land has been identified in the Kottayam District of Kerala for establishment of a new IIIT in Kerala. It was stated that the Government is facing difficulty in identifying the Industry Partners.

The NSC advised that the Government of Kerala needs to identify industry partners in the Private Sector and should explore the possibility of negotiating with companies involved in a big way in tapping the natural resources of the state like Food Processing industries, etc.

- 13. The Principal Resident Commissioner, Government of Tripura stated that 50 acres of land had been identified in Bodhjung Nagar, Tripura for setting up of the IIIT in Tripura. It was informed that while two companies, namely, Infinity Knowledge Ventures Pvt. Ltd and Indus Integrated Information management Itd have indicated their willingness, the Government would come back after selection of the third industry partner. The state contemplates to engage IIIT, Hyderabad as the mentoring institute.
- 14. The Commissioner, Technical Education, Government of Andhra Pradesh stated that the proposal is under evaluation by the State Government and the DPR would be submitted by the Government of Andhra Pradesh by March, 2012.
- 15. It was generally felt that knowledge development and linguistic growth, forest based activities and livelihood-driven projects need to be kept in focus while industry related competencies are being planned. The value proposition for the IIIT has to be driven by partners who help generate value added in society for which computing competencies of a high order are necessary. Such project will be an important ingredient in sensitizing the IIIT and nudging it in the right direction and Committee would do well to keep in mind while assessing other proposals that we receive in future.
- 16. After deliberations, the NSC took following decisions:
 - a. A Sub-Group of the National Steering Committee consisting of Joint Secretary, MHRD, Professor Rajeev Sanghal, Director, IIIT-Hyderabad and Shri Anjan Das, Executive Director, CII, was formed to examine the DPR on the proposals received from the State Governments of Rajasthan, Madhya Pradesh, Himachal Pradesh and Assam within a month in light of the observations made by the NSC and submit the same for the final approval of the Hon'ble Minister of Human Resource Development. NSC was authorised the Sub-Group to scrutinize the



cases on its behalf and submit the same to MHRD for further approval of Hon'ble Human Resource Development Minister. The Sub-Group would act as standing committee of the National Steering Committee to scrutinise the proposals received from various State Governments, from time to time, for consideration and final decision by the NSC.

- b. It is mandatory that the Site Selection Committee would visit the site(s)/ land identified for establishment of the new IIIT to ascertain its suitability and give its recommendations thereon. The committee will consist of Joint Secretary in charge IIITs, Principal Secretary, Technical Education of the concerned State Government one of the Directors of the existing IIITs (to be nominated by the MHRD) and Suptd. Engineer / Executive Engineer, CPWD in the concerned state.
- c. The Site Selection Committee would visit the Site/Land identified by the State Governments of Rajasthan, Madhya Pradesh and Himachal Pradesh at the earliest.
- d. It was decided that as envisaged in the scheme the IIIT may, initially, be registered as Societies under the Society Registration Act, 1860.
- e. Each State Government would be given a period of two months for signing of the Tripartite Memorandum of Understanding to ensure clarity of roles and responsibilities of the Industry partner, the State Government and the Central Government.
- f. It will be mandatory that 50% of the money to be contributed by the Industry partner towards the scheme should be in the form of a irrevocable Bank Guarantee from a Nationalized bank in the name of the State Government.
- g. The Draft Memorandum of Association & Rules of the IIIT would be circulated to the State Governments by MHRD.
- h. The member Sub-Group set up for evaluation of proposals from the States may also work-out the details of the Faculty Development Programme, including identification of lead Institutions in consultations with State Governments.

MINUTES OF THE 3RD MEETING OF THE NATIONAL STEERING COMMITTEE ON SETTING UP 20 NEW IIITS IN PPP MODE HELD ON 19TH SEPTEMBER, 2012

The 3rd meeting of the National Steering Committee (NSC) for setting up of 20 New IIITs in PPP mode was held under the Chairpersonship of Education Secretary on 19-09-2012. The list of participants who attended the meeting is at Annexure-1.

At the outset, Education Secretary welcomed the participants and staled that he was happy to note that the Scheme for setting up of 20 new IIITs in the PPP mode was gathering momentum with the State Governments showing enthusiasm in implementing the Scheme. In this context, he also mentioned about the four proposals received from the State Governments which were coming up before the Committee for its consideration.

Thereafter, the Agenda Items were taken up for detailed deliberations.

Item No.1 Confirmation of the Minutes of the 2nd Meeting of the National Steering Committee.

The minutes of the 2nd meeting of the NSC were confirmed along with incorporation of the modification in para-11 of the minutes, as suggested by the Government of Karnataka.

Item No.2 Action Taken Report on the decision taken in the 2^{nd} Meeting of NSC.

The Action Taken Report with regard to the various decisions taken in the 2nd meeting was noted by the NSC. The Chairman desired that the Site Selection Committee should complete the visits to all the concerned States in a time-bound manner to assess the suitability of the land. The Committee also reiterated that 50% of the money to be contributed by the 'Industry Partner towards the Scheme should be in the form of an irrevocable bank guarantee from a nationalized

bank in the name of State Govt. and desired that a letter in this regard may be sent by the Ministry to all the State Govts. for necessary clarity in implementation.

Item No.3 Modification of the Scheme and finalization of the IIIT Bill, 2012 by the Central Government.

NSC took note of the approval given by the Cabinet in its meeting held on 17-08-2012 for introduction of the IIIT Bill 2012 in the Parliament. as also the modification in the scheme providing for flexibility to the State Governments to bring in one or more Industry Partners who could also be Central or State PSUs.

Item No.4 Finalization/Recommendation of the proposals received from the State by the Sub-Group of the NSC

The NSC was informed that the Sub-Group of the NSC, constituted in the 2nd meeting of Committee, held a meeting on 05-06-2012 and recommended "he proposals for selling up of an lilT each in the States of Assam. Rajasthan and Tripura for approval of the competent authority Subsequent to the approval by the Hon'ble Minister the concerned State Governments have been conveyed the decision on 2nd July, 20 12.

The NSC ratified the recommendation made in this regard by the Sub-Group of the NSC.

Item No.5 Faculty Development Programme (FDP)

Prof. Rajeev Sangal, Director, IIIT-Hyderabad explained the proposed Faculty Development Programme to the members of the Steering Committee and the Special Invitees of the State Government.

He highlighted that the Faculty Development Program was critical to the success of the new lilTs as there was a shortage of faculty in general and in the case of faculty for these institutions. right set of skills and values also needed to be inculcated. These facult y should be able to (i) do research that can connect with industry needs. (ii) develop new methods of teaching. and (iii) inculcate human values and societal mindset among students.

iii)

iv)

Faculty Development Program is to be conducted by the Lead Mentor Institution (LMI) as per the Scheme. Criteria for selection of the LMI as laid down by Expert Sub Committee (Annexure III of agenda notes) was discussed and approved.

It was felt that the FDP needs to be started as early as possible so that the faculty would become available to the new lilTs right in their first year of operation (in academic year 2013-14) and for the purpose it was decided that IIIT-Hyderabad be asked to conduct the FDP at the earliest. It was also decided that. if necessary. one more institution may be considered as Lead Mentor Institution who could be selected out of older IITs and some selected NITs. This may be decided after a few months seeing how the Scheme progresses.

The NSC, committee approved the decision taken by the Sub-Group of the NSC on the FDP.

Item No.6 Proposals for setting up of lilTs for consideration of NSC

The Member Secretary, NSC explained that the proposals of four State Governments namely, Madhya Pradesh, Himachal Pradesh, Karnataka and Tamil Nadu are presented in the meeting for consideration by the Committee:

i) The Government of Madhya Pradesh made a representation indicating revised proposal of the State Government which has since finalized two Industry Partners, namely. i Core Education Pvt. Ltd. and Trident Info Tech Ltd with contribution of ₹9.60 crores each. On a query by the Chairman, the Secretary. IT, Govt. of M.P. clarified that i Core Education Pvt. Ltd. was not a education service provider but a Section 25 company eligible for partnership under the Scheme.

The NSC recommended the proposal of Government of Madhya Pradesh,

ii) The proposal of Government of Himachal Pradesh was considered by the Committee and it was noted that in the revised DPR the Industry Partners chosen by the State Government are HP Drug Manufactures Association C/o Single window Clearance Agency Building Baddi: Baddi Barotiwala Industry Association

and Forum Hydro Power Producers Sutlej Basin with each Industry Partner making pro-rata contribution of ₹@6.4 crores each.

The NSC recommended the proposal for approval, subject to the condition that firm commitments made by each of the Industry Partners are submitted to the Ministry in advance.

Principal Secretary, Govt. of Karnataka unheated that the State PSU, Karnataka State Electronics Development Corporation (KEONICS). had given a letter of undertaking to provide ₹19 crores over a period of four years as Industry Partner's contribution towards meeting the capital expenditure of the proposed IIIT.

The NSC was of the view that it may be difficult to agree to the proposal for accepting the Industry Partner's contribution in a phased manner as it was against the laid down policy. It was suggested that the Govt. of Karnataka may, therefore, revisit the proposal. The representative of the State Govt. informed that the they were still trying to identify / finalize more Private Industry Partners to be associated with the scheme.

The NSC approved the proposal, subject to the condition that a firm financial commitment is made accordingly by the Industry Partner in advance and the same is submitted to the Ministry. The NSC also advised the State Govt. to make efforts to Identify / finalize some Private Industry Partner(s) as well.

The Addl. Chief Secretary, Govt, of Tamil Nadu made a presentation regarding setting up of the lilTs in Shri Rangan, Tiruchirapalli. Chennai and informed that six private companies and four State Public Sector Undertakings have agreed to participate with a contribution of Rs. 2 crores each for setting up of the IIIT In the State.

The NSC was of the view that the Government of Tamil Nadu may revisit the proposal and the number of Industry Partners be reduced as the Scheme envisaged gene rally not more than five Industry Partners.

The NSC accorded 'in-principle' approval to the proposal of the Government of Tamil Nadu subject to fulfillment of the above stipulation, as also firm financial commitment of each of the Industry Partners well in advance.

Tile Commissioner, Technical Education, Govt. of Andhra Pradesh informed the Committee that they have identified requisite land and were in the process of identifying Industry Partners for setting up of a IIIT in the PPP mode in the Slate.

On a query raised by the representative of Government of Tripura the NSC look a view that

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the State Government was free to change the proposed Industry Partners and if necessary take on board a Public Sector Undertaking at this stage, but not after the MoU is signed amongst the stakeholders.

Given the fact that this was a new Scheme with hardly any precedent of its kind, requiring role clarity on the part of all the three stakeholders i.e the Central Govt., State Govt. and the Industry Partner(s)s a suggestion was made by the Addl. Secretary, Technical Education, MHRD that Director, IIIT- Hyderabad, Prof. R. Sangal, could be requested to organize a two-day workshop to sensitize all concerned of the basic aim and objectives of the proposed lilTs. its governance structure as also the roadmap for implementation of the Scheme in a focused manner.

The NSC unanimously agreed that it was a welcome idea and requested Prof. Rajeev Sangal, IIIT- Hyderabad to develop a framework for holding the workshop in consultation with Addl. Secretary, MHRD.

Item No.7 Draft Memorandum of Understanding to be signed

by the Central Government, State Government and Industry Partners.

Item No.8 Draft Memorandum of Association and Rules and Regulations of the proposed IIITs.

There was a general discuss ion on the subject. The Principle Secretary. High er Technical Education , Govt. of Rajasthan as well as representative of the Govt . of Assam brought out that the proposed drafts suffered from some inconsistency and perhaps even some legal infirmities, requiring a comprehensive review.

The NSC took note of the observations made and decided to constitute to a small Committee consisting of Principal Secretary, Govt. of Rajasthan, Managing Director. AMTRON, Govt. of Assam and JS(TE), MHRD which would deliberate on the draft MoU, MoA and the Rules and submit the revised drafts to the Chairman, National Steering Committee at an early date for taking a final view in this regard before the same are circulated to the State Governments.

The meeting ended with a vote of thanks.

B.4 MINUTES OF 1ST STATE STEERING COMMITTEE MEETING 21ST NOV, 2011

MINUTES OF THE FIRST STATE STEERING COMMITTEE MEETING FOR SETTING UP OF INDIAN INSTITUTE OF INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY AND ADVANCE SCIENCES (IIITAS), GUWAHATI HELD ON 21st NOVEMBER, 2011 AT 11.00 AM IN THE CONFERENCE ROOM OF THE CHIEF SECRETARY, ASSAM SECRETARIAT, DISPUR

Members Present: See Annexure- I

Shri. H.K. Sharma, Commissioner & Secretary, Education (Higher), Govt. of Assam welcomed the members present, on behalf of the Government of Assam. He gave the opening remarks and a brief introduction of the project of setting up of IIITAS in Guwahati.

Thereafter, Dr. Himanta Biswa Sarma, Hon'ble Minister for Education, Health & FW, Govt. of Assam, welcomed the members once again and briefly dwelt on the far sighted thinking of the Government of Assam and the Hon'ble Chief Minister regarding the project and the formation of the SSC, which he described as a unique experience as it drew a panel of very distinguished members from the national and international academia and industry. He briefly explained about the project and stated that the Govt. of India has earmarked 20 IIIT's to be set up across the country in PPP mode. He also mentioned the desire of the Hon'ble Chief Minister to focus on advancement in sciences for the larger benefit of the society, and hence the institute would not only be dealing with all aspects of Information Technology but also should draw its strength from research and development in advance and applied sciences. He said that the institute would represent kind of a mix between IIIT, Hyderabad and Indian Institute of Sciences, Bangalore and hence should be aptly be named as Indian Institute of Information Technology and Advance Sciences (IIITAS). The Hon'ble Minister opined that the Institute would have an International character and would be groomed as a South East Asian Hub of education.

Hon'ble Minister thanked Shri. S. Ramadorai, Advisor to the Hon'ble Prime Minister of India, National Council on Skill Development, New Delhi on accepting to become the first Chairman of IIITAS, Guwahati. He also read out the names other other luminaries who had accepted to be on the Board of the Institute and expressed his gratitude and thanked them on behalf of the Government of Assam.

Hon'ble Minister also expressed his gratitude to Shri. Manmohan Singh, Hon'ble Prime Minister of India and Shri. Kapil Sibal, Minister of Communications and Information Technology for their encouragement and support provided to set up the Institute at Guwahati.

Thereafter, Shri S. Ramadorai, Chairman, SSC welcomed all the members present and said that he was happy that the 3 (three) industry partners had taken a very positive initiative by opting to be a part of this great initiative of the Govt. of Assam to set up the Institute. He pointed out that this Institute should be of World-class standard and meet the aspirations of the people of North-east.

He invited members present to put forward their respective views and suggestions and took up the agenda matter one by one.

Thereafter, Shri. M.K. Yadava, MD AMTRON, gave a brief presentation on IIIT scheme as a whole outline the salient features, partnership model, financial sharing and management of the Institute. He also gave a brief description on the objectives, framework, criteria for selecting industry partners, various infrastructures required for the Institute, financial model and also mentioned about the advantages of setting up the Institute in Guwahati and the road ahead for the project.



Professor Rajeev Sangal, Director, IIIT Hyderabad, in his presentation detailed the goals and benefits of IIIT's. Prof. Sangal, pointed out that since this Institute would be a joint effort of academics and industry, major growth is expected in the domestic market. The output of this Institute would be firstly high quality manpower and secondly the research and technology development. He cited the outcomes of the Institute, and benefits of the Institute to the Industry, State Government, Central Government and also the industry partners. He concluded by saying that this Institute would not only create professionals but human beings with strong human values who will contribute to build a better society.

Shri. N. M. Bora, CMD, Oil India Ltd., complimented the Government of Assam for the initiatives taken to set up a world-class institute in Guwahati. He also thanked the Government of Assam to have shown their confidence in opting for Oil India Ltd. to become one of the industry partners for the Institute which would further enable the company in fulfilling the corporate social responsibilities. He assured that on receiving a formal communication from the Government of Assam regarding the project, he will place the proposal in a special convened Board for the purpose and communicate the decision of the Board to the Govt. at an early date.

Shri. O.P. Bhatt, Former Chairman of SBI, expressed pleasure for his association with this Institute. He was of the opinion that right kind of leadership is very important for the success of the Institute. He laid stress on the selection of the right man as director of the Institute. He opined that a vision/mission statement should also be drafted and the roles of the industry partners should be clearly defined without any overlaps. He emphasized that research done should be on local domain with a global applicability.

Shri. N.K. Das, Chief Secretary, Government of Assam, on behalf of the Government of Assam assured that the Govt. of Assam would provide all help and assistance so that the Institute came up in the shortest possible time. He expressed his happiness to inform the members that the land, which often would become the biggest bottleneck in projects, and which was the prime requisite for the project, was fortunately available and already requisitioned for the IT Park. He reiterated that the Govt. would acquire further land to ensure that both the projects came side by side deriving mutual benefits.

The Committee discussed the agenda points and arrived at the following decisions enlisted below:

 The names as suggested by Shri. S. Ramadorai, Advisor to Hon'ble Prime Minister of India, vide his letter dated 4th November, 2011 for inclusion in the SSC were accepted unanimously by all the members.

The Govt, of Assam was requested to issue formal communication to the members concerned.

- 2. The members approved the names of the industry partners, subject to their concurrence, suggested earlier for the proposed IIITAS, Guwahati. The names of the industry partners are:
 - a. TATA GROUP, as a Private Industry Partner
 - b. OIL INDIA LTD., as an Industry Partner, being a Central PSU
 - c. AMTRON, as an Industry Partner, being a State PSU.

The Govt, of Assam was requested to write to each of the industry partners for providing a letter of commitment with a minimum contribution of Rs. 2.00 crore towards the formation of the institute.

- 3. The members authorized the Chairman to undertake a visit to the site and give his recommendation accordingly as regards suitability of the site for the proposed institute. It was also decided that The Chairman would visit the site at Mirza, Guwahati on the 22nd November, 2011 and give his opinion.
- The proposal for setting up of IIITAS, Guwahati by Govt. of Assam would be submitted to Govt. of India after finalizing on the project cost and financial details in consultation with the Chairman and Director, IIIT, Hyderabad.
- The Detailed Project Report (DPR) as per GOI guideline will be submitted to Ministry of HRD, GOI subsequent to communication to be received by Govt. of India on submission of the preliminary proposal.
- 6. The draft Act for the IIITAS, Guwahati along with the Memorandum of Association of the Society will be prepared after consulting with Planning & Finance Department, Govt. of Assam and will be placed in the next meeting for approval. It was decided to hold the next meeting in 30 to 45 days time either at new Delhi, Mumbai or any suitable location as per convenience of the Chairman.
- The draft Bye-law for the IIITAS Society for governance of the Institute will be prepared and placed in the next meeting for approval. At the outset, the Institute would be made functional as a society.
- 8. AMTRON would act as the Secretariat until the Director of the Institute is appointed.
- It was decided to hold the first academic session of the proposed IIITAS, Guwahati from August 2012 from a hired premises.

Shri. Ranjit Barthakur, Advisor (Investment) to Hon'ble Chief Minister of Assam, gave the concluding remarks. He quoted two key words i.e. innovation and invention along with sustainability are the success factors for the Institute. He concluded the meeting with a Vote of Thanks to the Chair.

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Note (On First Action Taken Report): The Chairman Sri S. Ramadorai along with Hon'ble Education Minister and other members and officials visited the proposed site of the Institute at Mirza, Guwahati on the 22nd November, 2011 at 10.00 AM. The list of the members of SSC and officials present on the occasion is shown at Annexure-II. The Chairman after visiting the site and holding discussion with Hon'ble Minister and other officials approved of the site and requested the Govt. of assam to go ahead with the process of acquiring additional land to the extent of 100 acres or more keeping in mind the future expansion requirements of the Institute as well as the IT Park. He also suggested that the Institute and the IT Park must draw synergy from each other by taking advantage of the common infrastructure between them. He also suggested to undertake a program of skilling and other welfare measures for the villages the families therein that have donated land for the great cause.

MINUTES OF THE EMERGENT STATE STEERING COMMITTEE MEETING OF INDIAN INSTITUTE OF INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY (IIIT), GUWAHATI HELD ON 21" JULY, 2012 AT 2:30 PM AT TISS OFFICE, UZAN BAZAR, GUWAHATI

Shri S. Ramadorai, Advisor to the Hon'ble PM, National Council on Skill Development and Chairman, SSC welcomed all the members present and thanked all for attending the SSC Meeting at Guwahati at a short notice.

Thereafter, MD, AMTRON gave an overview of the development so far. He stated that

- The Ministry of HRD, Govt. of India has issued an D.O. Communication stating that the Competent Authority has approved to the proposal for setting up a new Indian Institute of Information Technology at Village Bongora in the state of Assam on PPP mode.
- Prof. Rajeev Sangal, Director, IIIT Hyderabad had requested for floating of advertisement for selection of faculty members as on urgent basis.
- III) The Education(Higher) department, Govt. of Assam has moved for funds required for land acquisition to P&D and Finance department, Govt. of Assam.

Principal Secretary, Revenue and Disaster Management, Govt. of Assam pointed out that the legal issues for acquisition of land for the proposed IIIT should be sorted out. He advised to constitute a sub-committee for sorting out the issues of the land. He also stated that as decided in the Mumbal meeting an interim Director need to be appointed and after that the faculties for the proposed IIIT can be selected.

Principal Secretary, IT, Govt. of Assam stated that Sri Rajeev Sangal can be appointed as Interim Director of the institute and as Interim Director he should take the onus of recruiting the faculty for the IIIT.

Commissioner (Higher) Education said that, MoHRD, Govt. of India does not seem to be interested in starting a temporary campus as was clearly mentioned in the last National Steering Committee meeting held at New Delhi on 14" March,2012. He expressed that the the Education(Higher) department has funds to run the IIIT from a hired premises to start with and the first session of IIIT, Guwahati can be started from July, 2013.

MD, AMTRON told the members that the Society formed for the IIIT needs to be registered. Principal Secretary, Revenue and Disaster Management said that the Society needs to be registered and then only number of actions would follow suit.

After threadbare discussions the following decisions were arrived at.

 A Sub Committee may be formed under the Chairmanship of Principal Secretary, Revenue & Disaster Management, Govt. of Assam and other members consisting of Commissioner (Higher) Education, MD, AMTRON and Deputy Commissioner, Kamrup to handle the land acquisition matters.

DRAFT MINUTES OF THE STATE STEERING COMMITTEE MEETING OF INDIAN INSTITUTE OF INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY (IIIT), GUWAHATI HELD ON 4th Dec, 2012 AT 2:30 PM AT AIR INDIA BUILDING, MUMBAI.

Members Present: See Annexure - I

Shri S.Ramadorai, Advisor to the Hon'ble PM, National Council on Skill Development and Chairman, SSC welcomed all the members present and thanked all for attending the SSC Meeting at Mumbai. He also welcomed Dr. Devi Shetty and Prof. Rajeev Sangal who attended the meeting via Video Conference / Tele Conference.

Thereafter, Dr. Himanta Biswa Sarma, Hon'ble Minister for Education, Health & FW, Govt. of Assam, welcomed and thanked all the members once again.

The Chairman then asked the members to put forward their views and suggestions and took up the agenda matter one by one.

1. Appointment of Sri Rajeev Sangal as Mentor Director of IIIT Guwahati.

Sri H.K. Sharma, Commissioner & Secretary (Higher & Technical) Govt. of Assam informed the members that Dept. of Higher Education (Technical) Govt. of Assam has issued the No Objection Certificate vide the office notification ATE.244/2011/121, Dtd. 10th October,2012 regarding appointment of Sri Rajeev Sangal, Director, IIIT Hyderabad as the Interim Director / Mentor Director for IIIT Guwahati.

Dr. Himanta Biswa Sarma expressed his views that Sri Rajeev Sangal should be appointed as the Interim Director of IIIT Guwahati till the full time Director is appointed.

All the members agreed to the proposal and was approved by the Chairman.

2. Allotment of Land for IIIT Guwahati & Temporary Campus of IIIT:

Sri S. Ramadorai enquired about the status of the land required for the IIIT Guwahati campus.

Sri S.K. Roy, Deputy Commissioner, Kamrup stated that Govt. of Assam has initiated the process of land acquisition. In this regard two Gazette notifications have already been published by the Land Acquisition Branch for acquiring 285 Bighas:2Katha:15 Lessa (90.4 Acres). The process for acquisition of balance land is in progress. He informed the members that the possession of the land will take around 5 (five) months time.

Sri. M.K.Yadava, MD, AMTRON informed the members that the site selection committee constituted by the Ministry of HRD, Govt. of India had visited Guwahati on 1st October, 2012 and had expressed their satisfaction regarding the site. The site selection committee had expressed their views that Govt. of Assam should scout for a temporary campus for IIIT Guwahati, as it would take a minimum period of three to four years for the full fledged campus to be ready.

Dr. Himanta Biswa Sarma suggested that the main IIIT Guwahati campus design should be planned under the guidance and approval of Prof. Rajeev Sanghal, Director, IIIT, Hyderabad and Prof. Gautam Barua, Director IIT, Guwahati.

Dr. Devi Shetty aired his views suggesting that the campus should be built within a time frame of two years and the minimum area should be of 100 Acres. Regarding the design of the institute, he suggested that the campus of Indian Institute of Management, Bangalore should be taken as the model which has a beautiful layout and surroundings.

2013 2014

Sri. H.K. Sharma informed the members that a temporary campus with an area of 34,000 sq. ft. in Bamunimaidan in the heart of the city, have already been identified by Higher(Technical) Education department and is in the final stages of approval. However construction and renovation would be required as the complex has been remaining idle for quite a long period. The construction and renovation works will take around three months.

Prof. Gautam Barua, Director, IIT Guwahati stated that two key areas require attention of the temporary campus.

- I) Hostel Accommodation for the students, shouldn't be very far from the campus.
- Staff Quarters for the faculty members.

If possible they should be accommodated in the nearby flats / residential complexes.

Sri S.Ramadorai enquired about the total intake of the students to be absorbed in the temporary campus.

Sri H.K. Sharma stated that there will be an intake of 60 students in the 1st year and each student will require a minimum of 120 sq. ft area as hostel accommodation.

Sri R. Barthakur viewed that the temporary campus should be designed under the supervision of the Interim Director as per the institutes requirements.

3. Recruitment of Faculty:

Sri M.K. Yadava, explained about the proposal for recruitment of first batch of lecturers for the proposed IIIT Guwahati under a Lecturer-cum-PhD programme under the IIIT Hyderabad in order to enable functioning of IIIT Guwahati from the 2013-14 academic session. He stated that Prof. Rajeev Sangal, Director IIIT Hyderabad had communicated that the Lecturer cum PhD program will start from 27th December, 2012 and hence the recruitment process should be done immediately. In this regard an advertisement was issued in leading national and local newspapers on 22nd November,2012 after due approval of Chairman and Vice Chairman of the SSC. He informed the members that till date 550 applicants had applied on-line.

Sri S. Ramadorai requested Prof Gautam Barua to chair the selection committee for the selection of lecturers and Prof Barua agreed to the same.

The other members nominated by the SSC were

- I) Prof. Rajeev Sanghal, Director IIIT Hyderabad or his nominee

4. Starting of Academic Session:

Sri R.Barthakur requested the SSC members that all possible steps should be taken so that the academic session can be started from 1st week of August, 2013.

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Sri Himanta Biswa Sarma agreed that the academic session should start from the temporary campus from the academic session 2013-14 itself.

5. Adoption of MOA & MOU:

Sri M.K. Yadava informed the members that the Ministry of HRD, Govt. of India have circulated the draft MOU & MOA to be adopted for setting up of the IIITs in PPP mode.

The issue was discussed thread bare among the members regarding the adoption of the MOA & MOU for IIIT Guwahati and the following was decided

- The Society for IIIT Guwahati should be formed, defining the Structure of the Society and get it registered at the earliest.
- It was also decided that after registration of the Society, the process of Selection of The Director for IIIT Guwahati may be initiated by the State Steering Committee.

The meeting concluded with a Vote of thanks to the chair.

MINUTES OF THE FOURTH STATE STEERING COMMITTEE AND FIRST GOVERNING BODY MEETING OF INDIAN INSTITUTE OF INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY (IIIT), GUWAHATI HELD ON 6th MAY, 2013 AT 6:00 PM AT HOTEL ASHOK, NEW DELHI

Members Present: As per Annexure-I

Shri S. Ramadoral, Advisor to the Hon'ble PM, National Council on Skill Development welcomed all the members present and thanked all for attending the meeting in New Delhi. He also welcomed Shri Madhavan Nambiar who attended the meeting via Video Conference. He gave the opening remarks and thanked the leadership of Assam Govt, TATA Group, SREI, OIL, Medhassu, Novatium and AMTRON for agreeing to become industry partners in this educational venture. He stated that we are now in the process of starting the institute from August 2013.

MD, AMTRON also thanked all the members and informed the members about the latest status of IIIT Guwahati:

- a) All the Gazette Notifications for acquisition of IIIT Land has been notified by the Govt. of Assam,
- b) Ministry of HRD, Govt. of India has approved AMTRON & OIL as the additional industry partners in the project,
- c)Temporary campus for IIIT Guwahati at Assam Textile Institute, Ambari, Guwahati has been selected.

Dr. Himanta Biswa Sarma, Hon'ble Minister for Education, Health & FW, Govt. of Assam informed the members that after the last meeting held in Mumbai, IIIT Guwahati have made a very good progress. He informed that comments have been received by the State Govt. on the MoA and MoU and are now in a position to sign the MoU & MoA. He thanked the Principal Secretary, P&D, Govt. of Assam for sanctioning an initial fund for acquisition of land. He also informed that the State Govt. will need more funds for building a state of the art institute. He also informed the members that, Assam Textile Institute which is under the Education Dept (Technical) Govt. of Assam has a ready-made building with a built up space of around 20,000 sq. mtrs which needs some renovation and finishing works. He stated that with the appointment of Director and renovating the building, IIIT Guwahati can start functioning from the temporary campus from Aug'2013.

Commissioner & Secretary, Higher Education, Govt. of Assam,informed the members that 6 (six) faculties have already been recruited and are being trained at IIIT- Hyderabad.

MD, AMTRON briefed the members on the MOA and MoU of IIIT Guwahati.

Prof Gautam Barua, Director IIT, Guwahati stated that MOA signed by the IIIT Guwahati Governing Body members should be sent to Ministry of HRD, Govt. of India along with the Bank Guarantees which are to be submitted submitted by the Industry Partners, Govt. of India norms. He also suggested that IIT Guwahati be appointed the mentor institute of IIIT Guwahati for smooth functioning till the full time Director is appointed.

Then there was discussions on Recruitment and Admissions for the IIIT Guwahati to start functioning from August 2013. The committee noted that as the IIIT Guwahati Society has not yet been formed, the process of recruitment of Director and other officials cannot be started immediately. In any case it will take a month or two after the formation of the Society before appointments can be made. On the other hand, as admissions are to be based on the JEE (Mains) examination, announcement for admissions to take place in August, have to be made by the end of May. The Committee therefore stressed that the Society must be formed and the first Board appointed by the end of June 2013. In

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order to ensure that the Institute starts functioning from August 2013, the Committee decides to request IIT Guwahati to act as Mentor Institute till the end of 2013, and the Director IIT Guwahati to be the mentor Director of IIIT Guwahati till a regular Director is appointed.

Signing of MOU & MOA:

The Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) among the President of India, Governor Assam and Industry Partners was signed by the representatives of the Governor of Assam and the Industry Partners during the meeting. It was decided that the Managing Director, AMTRON will present the MoU to the Ministry of HRD (MoHRD), Govt. of India for signature on behalf of the President of India.

The Memorandum of Association (MoA) for the formation of the Indian Institute of Information Technology, Guwahati Society was signed by all members of the Society who were present at the meeting. It was decided that the Managing Director, AMTRON will inform all Industry partners requesting them to send a Bank Guarantee for Rs. One crore, valid for six months, in favour of the Govt. of Assam, as per one of the conditions of the MoU that was signed. Once all the Bank Guarantees are received, and signatures of all other members obtained, the MOA will be presented to Ministry HRD, Govt. of India for necessary signatures. MD, AMTRON and Commissioner & Secretary, Higher Education Department, Govt. of Assam will then take the necessary steps to register the Society. Once the Society is registered, Commissioner and Secretary, Higher Education, Govt. of Assam will request Ministry of HRD, Govt. of India to form the first Board as per clause 9(ii) of the MoA of the Society, and appoint the first Chairman of the Board as per Section A(1.1) of the MoU.


The following decisions were also taken with respect to the academic programme of IIIT Guwahati (these decisions are to be ratified by the first Board):

- Admissions will be given for B.Tech degrees in two programmes, namely, Computer Science and Engineering (CSE), and Electronics and Communication Engineering (ECE).
- 2.Each programme will admit 30 students.
- 3.Reservations for OBC, SC, ST, and PD categories will be as per the provisions of the Central Education Institutes (CEI) Reservations Act.
- 4.Fifty percent of the seats will be filled based on the JEE (Mains) all-India merit list, and fifty percent of the seats will be filled based on the JEE(Mains) Assam merit list. Mentor Director will inform the Central Board of JEE (Mains) of the above decisions once the Society is formed.
 5.The curriculum to be followed for the first semester will be the curriculum currently being followed at IIIT Hyderabad.
- 6.The fees to be charged to the entrants will be the same as that charged to students of IIT Guwahati, except that SC and ST students will get a 20% waiver of the tuition fees. The Committee noted that the annual tuition fees will be about Rs 90,000/- and that, including other fees and refundable security deposits, about Rs 60,000/- will have to be paid in the first semester and about Rs 52,000/- in the second semester.
- 7. Faculty to teach the first semester courses will include faculty deputed from IIT Guwahati, from State Colleges in Guwahati, and the trainee faculty already appointed and currently in IIIT Hyderabad.

The Chairman concluded the meeting with a Vote of thanks to the chair.

B.8 MINUTES OF 5TH STATE STEERING COMMITTEE MEETING 16TH DEC, 2013

Minutes of the Fifth Meeting of the State Steering Committee of Indian Institute of Information Technology, Guwahati held on December 16, 2013, at 6 PM, at the Hon'ble Chief Minister's Residence./

Members Present: As per Annexure 1.

Item 1 Confirmation of Minutes.

The Minutes of the Fourth Meeting of the SSC held on May 6, 2013 were confirmed.

Item 2 Action Taken Report

The Committee noted the actions taken against the decisions of the Fourth Meeting.

Item 3 Re-notification of the composition of the SSC

The change in the composition of the SSC was noted.

Item 4 Presentation on the Current Status of the Institute's operations.

The Committee noted the current status of the Institute's operations and expressed satisfaction at the progress made. Even though the funds situation at present was satisfactory, the need for a cash flow analysis to help determine the fees and expenditures was stressed.

Item 5 Issue of Bank Guarantees by the Industry Partners

The Committee noted that the Bank Guarantees by the Industry Partners were given with a validity of six months and that most of them will expire soon, with one having already expired. The Committee noted that since the Society of the Institute was formed, there was no need for bank guarantees anymore and industry partners should now pay 50% of their share in capital expenditure. The Convenor of the Committee may write to the Industry Partners requesting them to make payments to IIIT Guwahati.

Item 6 Funds Position

The Committee noted the position of funds. The Committee noted that Rs. 5 crores has been received from MHRD (Rs. 3 crores against recurring expenditure and Rs. 2 crores against non-recurring expenditure). The Committee was informed that Rs 15 crores was likely to be transferred by the Govt. of Assam as part of its share for capital expenditure shortly. The Committee also noted that Rs 3 crores are to be allotted by the Govt. of Assam for the construction of the building at Assam Textile Institute being used by IHIT Guwahati. Besides this, Rs. 30 crores has already been earmarked for land acquisition by the State Govt.

Item 7 Approval for the Recruitment of Faculty and the Current Status

The Committee noted the approval granted by the Govt of Assam for the recruitment of faculty at the Assistant Professor level, on contract (CSE – 4, ECE – 4, Mathematics – 2, English – 1, Economics – 1). The Committee ratified this decision.

The Committee was also informed that six lecturers were selected by the Govt, of Assam in December 2012 and deputed to IIIT, Hyderabad to pursue their Ph.D. and to get training in academics. These lecturers joined IIIT, Guwahati once the classes commenced. Their salary is being paid by IIIT. Guwahati since August 2013 (with the Govt of Assam making payments from January to July, 2013). These lecturers have now got admission into the Ph.D. programme at IIT. Guwahati and so they do not need to go to IIIT, Hyderabad anymore. The Committee approved their formal appointment on contract at IIIT. Guwahati with effect from August 1, 2013.

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Item 8 Status on Land Acquisition

The Committee was informed that the process of land acquisition was at an advanced stage. An area of 341 bighas (including 40 bighas of Govt. land) was in the process of acquisition. The Honourable Chief Minister desired that the acquisition be completed at the earliest so that the campus could be inaugurated by the Prime Minister sometime in February, 2014. It was also decided to be as economical as possible as regards the requirement of land.

Item 9 Requirements of Space for the July, 2014 Academic Year

The Committee noted that more space will be required in the temporary premises in 2014 and in 2015 as more batches of students join. The Committee was informed that an estimate of Rs 5 crores has been put up and a request for funds will be made soon to the Govt of Assam.

The Committee was also informed that about 50 flats will be required to house the students, faculty and staff of the Institute by July, 2014. The Committee resolved that the Govt. of Assam be requested to extend necessary assistance in identifying suitable space that could be taken on lease.

Item 10 Hiring of Support Staff

The Committee advised against any recruitment as proposed and suggested that this be placed before the Board of Governors once it is formed.

The Committee approved the appointment of suitable personnel including retired employees as OSD on contract basis, as per norms of the Govt. of Assam.

The Committee had no objection to the use of Ph.D. students from IIT, Guwahati to assist in the academic activities of the Institute on payment of suitable honorarium for the January – April, 2014 semester.

Item 11 Inputs on Appointment of Chairman Board of Governors and the Board of IIITG.

The Committee was informed that the Govt of Assam has sent a panel of five names to the industry partners for their inputs for the position of Chairman Board of Governors of IIIT. Guwahati. Once inputs were received, a panel of five names will be sent to the Govt of India.

The Committee was also informed that the names of nominees of the Govt of Assam to the Board of IIIT, Guwahati have been approved and are being sent to the Govt, of India.

Item 12 Delegation of Powers of Chairman Board

The Committee did not agree to any delegation of powers at this stage as the selection of a Chairman and the formation of a Board were at an advanced stage.

Item 13 Any other matter

As there was no other matter, the meeting ended with a vote of thanks to the Chair.

WHEREAS it has been the intent of THE FIRST PARTY to address to the increasing skill challenges of the Indian IT industry, as also to develop new knowledge in Information Technology and to provide manpower of global standards for the Information Technology and

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AND WHEREAS in pursuance of the afore mentioned, it is proposed to take up a Scheme for "Setting up 20 new Indian Institutes of information Technology (IIITs) through Public Private Partnership" (hereinafter called THE SCHEME);

AND WHEREAS all the three above named PARTIES commit to set up under this SCHEME an Indian Institute of Information Technology, Guwahati (hereinafter called THE IIIT) registered initially as a Society under the Societies Registration Act, 1860.

THE PARTIES HEREBY AGREE TO THE FOLLOWING:

SECTION A: BOARD OF GOVERNORS

- 1.0 The society will have a BOARD OF GOVERNORS (hereinafter called THE BOARD) for THE IIIT which would be the principal executive body of the Institute having adequate administrative and financial powers. It would be entrusted with the task of managing the affairs of the IIIT. The composition of the Board, and its powers and functions etc would be according to the terms and conditions spelt out in the Memorandum of Association and Rules and Regulations of the Society appended with this MOU.
- 1.1 However, the first chairperson of the Board shall be appointed by the First Party, in consultation with the Second Party and Third Party. The other members of the First Board of Governors, who are to be co-opted by the Board, shall be appointed by the Central Government in consultation with the Second Party and Third Party and the Chairperson.

SECTION B: ROLE OF THE FIRST PARTY

1. THE FIRST PARTY shall:

- (i) contribute 50% of the total capital cost of Rs.128.00 crore, over a period of time, for setting up of THE IIIT, including seed money to the extent of Rs. 10.00 crores that would be released by the Central Government during the first financial year of the inception of the Institute.
- (ii) provide partial financial support to the extent of Rs.10.00 crore (Rupees Ten crore) to THE IIIT towards recurring expenditure during the first four years of setting up THE IIIT, depending on actual year-wise requirement of THE IIIT;
- (iii) and provide funds under the Scheme for faculty development programme.

(in respect of North-Eastern Region the Central Government contribution shall be to the extent of 57.5% of the total capital cost)

2. Based on the Institute Development Plan (hereinafter called THE IDP) developed by THE BOARD and approved by the State Steering Committee (hereinafter called THE SSC), the IDP forwarded by THE SSC will be examined by THE FIRST PARTY and the funds will be released within a reasonable period of time.

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- THE FIRST PARTY shall establish a National Steering Committee (hereinafter called 'THE NSC') which will be an Apex body for guiding the implementation and monitoring of THE SCHEME. The NSC shall have representatives of the Central Government, State Governments and Industry Partners of all the IIITs established under the Scheme.

The FIRST PARTY would, after establishment of 5-10 IIITs, on the recommendations of the Boards of the IIITs, constitute a Council of IIITs which would take over the functions of the National Steering Committee. SECTION B: ROLE OF THE SECOND PARTY:

5. THE SECOND PARTY will

- i) establish and maintain a State Implementation Cell (hereinafter called 'THE SIC'), with adequate staff to discharge its functions; and
- ii) assist the BOARD in any other manner to help achieve the objectives of improving quality of education and thereby provide better employment opportunities.

SECTION C: ROLE OF THE THIRD PARTY

- 1 To participate in THE SCHEME, THE THIRD PARTY has to:
- i) nominate its representative as members of THE BOARD.
- ii) contribute 15% of the total capital cost of Rs.128.00 crore, for setting up of THE IIIT, provided that in respect of North-Eastern Region the Industry contribution, shall be to the extent of 7.5% only. 50% of the money to be contributed by the Industry Partner(s) towards the scheme may be provided at the time of signing of the MoU in the form of an irrevocable Bank Guarantee in the name of the State Government from a Nationalized Bank by the Industry Partner(s). Once the MOA & Rules are framed and the IIIT is registered, the industry shall deposit in case 50% of its contribution in the name of the concerned IIIT. The remainder contribution would be made by the Industry Partner(s) depending upon the progress of the Scheme.

iii) to contribute towards research labs and projects, internship, faculty chairs etc., from time to time, in furthering the objects of THE SCHEME.

SECTION D: MONITORING MECHANISM

All the three stakeholders shall be responsible for monitoring the implementation of the TED scheme. The responsibilities of all the PARTIES are as under: Ft. Thoralpakkam-Pallavaram Ring Road, Thoraipakkam, Chennal-600 096, Tamil Nadu, India

With the broad objective of improving the quality of education leading to better employability, all the three parties shall jointly agree and finalise Key Performance Indicators (KPIs) as yearly targets for next five years, for improving the internal as well external efficiency of THE IIIT against the base line information. These parameters shall be used to evaluate the success of THE SCHEME. An agreed KPIs and signed by the BOARD Chairman on behalf of BOARD and THE SECOND PARTY shall be appended to this Memorandum and shall be deemed to be an integral part of this Memorandum.

 - iv) In case of unsatisfactory performance in implementation of THE SCHEME, including achievement of KPIs, THE BOARD shall submit a detailed report to THE SSC within 30 days of receipt of a notice in this regard, interalia indicating the reasons for failure and measures required to be taken.
 - v) THE SSC shall forward this report to THE NSC with their comments. THE NSC shall fix responsibility for such failure and ensure that necessary action is taken.

SECTION E: RELEASE OF FUNDS, ITS UTILISATION

- 1. The funds received by THE BOARD shall be kept in a separate bank account opened in the name of THE BOARD. Any private contributions, special grants received from State Government and revenue generated by THE BOARD shall also be deposited in this bank account.
- 2. The funds may be used for the following purposes:
- Civil works in the IIIT.
- ii) For procurement of machinery and equipment.
- iii) For activities directly related to infrastructure under THE SCHEME such as, engaging consultants for preparation of IDPs, hiring contract faculty for running courses, etc.
- 3. Any deviation from the above pattern of use of funds has to be justified in the IDP and has to be approved by THE FIRST PARTY on case to case basis.
- 4.Each IIIT shall meet its operating expenditure on its own within five years of commencement out of students' fees, research and other internal accruals.

SECTION F : MISCELLANEOUS

1. Name of the Society

2. Registered Office

3. Definitions

In this Memorandum unless the context otherwise requires:-

- (a) "Board', means the Board of Governors of the Society and shall be synonymous with the Board of Governors of the Institute:

- (c) "Chairperson" means the Chairperson of the Board of the Society and shall be synonymous with Chairperson of the Institute;
- (d) "Institute" means Indian Institute of Information Technology, Guwahati;
- (e) "Rules and Regulations" in relation to the Society means the Rules and Regulation of the Society and shall be synonymous with the Rules and Regulations of the Institute;
- (f) "Society" shall mean the Indian Institute of Information Technology Guwahati Society;
- (g) "State Government" means Government of Assam;
- (h) "Director" shall mean Director of the Institute;
- (I) "Registrar" shall mean Registrar of the Institute;
- (i) "Scheme" shall mean the Scheme for setting up of 20 new Indian Institutes of information technology (IIITs) through Public Private Partnership (PPP) of the Ministry of Human Resources Development, Govt. of India, New Delhi;
- (k) "State Steering Committee", in short SSC, shall mean the State Steering Committee as notified by the Government of Assam for the IIIT Guwahati;
- (I) "Council" shall mean the Research Council.

4. Objects of the Society:

- (a) to establish, set up, run and carry on the administration and management of the Indian Institute of Information Technology, Guwahati;
- (b) to enable the institute to emerge amongst the foremost institutions in Information Technology and allied fields of knowledge;
- (c) to advance new knowledge and innovation in information technology and allied fields to power the nation to the forefront in the global context;
- (d) to develop competent and capable youth imbued with the spirit of innovation and entrepreneurship with the social and environmental orientation to meet the knowledge needs of the country and provide global leadership in information technology and allied

(e) to promote and provide transparency of highest order in matters of admission, appointments to various positions, academic evaluation, administration and image.

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Powers and Functions of the Society:

(1) For attainment of its objectives, the Society may exercise in the following functions, namely:

- (b) to lead, organize and conduct research and innovation in information technology and allied fields of knowledge in such manner as the society may think fit, including in collaboration or association with any other Institute, educational institution, research organisation or body corporate;
- (c) to hold examinations and grant degrees, diplomas, certificates and other academic or professional distinctions or titles; and to confer honorary degrees;

- (f) to make provision for dissemination of knowledge emerging from research and for that purpose to enter into such arrangements, including consultancy and advisory services, with other institutions, industry, civil society or other organizations, as the Institute may deem necessary;
- (g) to institute teaching, research or other academic positions, required by the Institute with such designations as it may deem fit, and to appoint persons on tenure, term or otherwise to such positions;
- (h) to appoint persons working in any other Institute or educational institution or involved in research of significance in any industry as adjunct, guest or visiting teachers of the Institute on such terms and for such duration as the Institute may decide;
- (i) to create administrative and other posts and to make appointments thereto;

(j) to determine, specify and receive payment of fees and other charges, as the society may deem fit, from students and any other person, institution or body corporate for instruction and other services, including training, consultancy and advisory services, provided by the Institute;

(k) to receive gifts, grants, donations, assistance or benefactions from the Central or State Government;

(I) to receive bequests, donations, contributions and transfers of movable or immovable properties from testators, donors, Institutes, Trusts, Companies or transferors, as the case may be, for the furtherance of the objectives of the Institute, provided that no such

benefaction shall be accepted by the Institute which involves conditions or obligations contrary to or not in accordance with the objects of the Institute;

- (m) to borrow, raise or secure the payment of any money on such terms and conditions and on such security, as may be deemed fit and proper provided they are not inconsistent with the objects of the Institute;
- (n) to acquire by way of lease, sublease, gift, purchase, exchange, hire or in any manner; any movable or immovable properties and any rights or privileges necessary or convenient for the purposes of the Institute and to construct, erect, alter, improve and maintain any building and to construct, improve, alter, demolish or repair buildings with a view to achieve the objects of the Institute in accordance with law;
- (o) to deal with any property belonging to or vested in the society in such manner as the society may deem fit for advancing the objects of the society:

Provided that no land or other immovable property shall be disposed off by the society without the prior approval of the Central Government:

Provided further that where the land for the society has been provided free of cost by the State Government, such land may be disposed off only with the prior approval of the State Government;

- (p) to establish and maintain such infrastructure as may be necessary for carrying out the objects of the society;
- (g) to institute and award fellowships, scholarships, exhibitions, prizes and medals;
- (r) to negotiate contracts on behalf of the society any vary and rescind such contracts;
- (s) to borrow, raise or secure the payment of any money on such terms and conditions and on such security, as may be deemed fit and proper provided they are not inconsistent with the objects of the society;
- (t) to do all such lawful things as may be necessary, incidental or conducive to the attainment of all or any of the objects of the society.
- (u) to make Rules and Bye-laws for the conduct of the affairs of the Society and to add, to amend, to vary or rescind them from time to time.

6. Institute to be open to all races, creeds and classes:

(1) The Institute shall be open to all persons of either sex, irrespective of caste, creed, religion, disability, domicile, ethnicity, social or economic background.

(2) Admissions to every programme of study in the Institute shall be based on merit assessed through transparent and reasonable criteria disclosed through its prospectus, prior to the commencement of the process of admission by such Institute:

Provided that the Institute shall be a Central Educational Institution for the purposes of the Central Educational Institutions (Reservation in Admission) Act, 2006.

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Rules and Regulations of the Society

1. Title

These Rules and Regulations may be called "Rules and Regulations of the Indian Institute of Information Technology, Guwahati Society", hereinafter referred to as "the Rules".

2. Definitions

In these Rules and Regulations, in addition to the definitions in the Memorandum of Association, unless the context otherwise requires -

- (a) "Board', means the Board of Governors of the Society and shall be synonymous with the Board of Governors of the Institute;
- (b) "Central Government" means the Government of India;
- (c) "Chairperson" means the Chairperson of the Board of the Society and shall be synonymous with Chairperson of the Institute;
- (d) "Institute" means Indian Institute of Information Technology, Guwahati;
- (e) "Rules and Regulations" in relation to the Society means the Rules and Regulation of the Society and shall be synonymous with the Rules and Regulations of the Institute;
- (f) "Society" shall mean the Indian Institute of Information Technology Guwahati Society;
- (g) "State Government" means Government of Assam;
- (h) "Director" shall mean Director of the Institute;
- (I) "Registrar" shall mean Registrar of the Institute;
- (j) "Scheme" shall mean the Scheme for setting up of 20 new Indian Institutes of information technology (IIITs) through Public Private Partnership (PPP) of the Ministry of Human Resources Development, Govt. of India, New Delhi;
- (k) "State Steering Committee", in short SSC, shall mean the State Steering Committee as notified by the Government of Assam for the IIIT Guwahati;
- (I) "Council" shall mean the Research Council;
- (I) "'Teacher" includes a Professor, Associate Professor, Assistant Professor, Lecturer or any person who is conferred with any equivalent designation for imparting education or conducting research in the Institute;
- 3. The general superintendence, direction and control of the affairs of the Society and its income and property shall be vested in the Managing Committee which shall be called the Board of Governors, hereinafter referred to as the "Board". This Board shall also be the Board of Governors for the Institute.

4. Authorities of the Institute

The following shall be the authorities of the Institute:-

- (a) The Board of Governors;
- (b) The Chairperson of the Board;
- (c) The Director of the Institute;
- (d) The Senate;
- (e) The Research Council;

(g) The Registrar of the Institute: Thoraipakkam-Pallavaram Ring Road,
(h) Such other Authorities appointed of monthated by the Boats, India

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5. The Board of Governors

(a) Composition of the Board

The Board shall be composed of the following members:-

(I) Chairperson, ex -officio;

(II) two persons from industry in the field of information technology, to be appointed by the Institute on approval of a specific name by the Board from a panel of names recommended by the Industry Partner.

(III) two persons from amongst faculty members of the Institute to be nominated by the Chairperson in consultation with the Director and two senior-most Deans of the Institute;

(IV) Two eminent persons having research experience in the field of information technology or allied fields, to be co-opted by the Board.

(V) Two persons having special knowledge or practical experience in respect of education, engineering, science or information technology, to be co-opted by the Board, provided that at least one such member shall be an expert from the I.T industry;

(VI) Two senior-most Deans of the Institute, ex-officio;

(VII) Director of Indian Institute of Technology located in the zone in which the Institute is located, ex -officio;

(Explanation.- For the purposes of this clause, "zone" shall have the meaning assigned to it in the Explanation to section 11 of the Institutes of Technology Act, 1961.)

(VIII) Vice-Chancellor of a University in the State to be nominated by the State Government in which the Institute is located, ex-officio;

(IX) One person to represent the Scheduled Castes or the Scheduled Tribes to be nominated by the State Government;

(X) Director of National Institute of Technology of the State in which the Institute is located, ex-officio:

(XI) Director of the Institute, who shall be the Member-Secretary of the Board, ex-officio;

(b) Term of the Membership

(i) Where a member of the Society or the Board becomes such member by reason of the Office he holds, his membership shall be terminated when he ceases to hold that office;

(ii) A member of the Society or the Board representing the Central, State Government or Industry partner shall continue to be such member during the pleasure of the concerned nomination;

(iii) Every other member of the Society or the Board including its Chairperson, but excluding the two senior most Deans of the Institute shall cease to be such member on the expiry of five years from the date of his appointment or nomination, but shall be eligible for re-appointment or re-nomination, as the case may be;

(iv) The two senior most Deans of the Institute shall hold office for a period for two years

but shall be eligible for re-nomination;

(v) Should any member representing the Central or the State Government is unable to attend a meeting of the Society or the Board, he shall be at liberty to appoint or authorize a representative to take his place at that meeting of the Society or the Boord and such representative shall have the rights and privileges of a member of the Society or the Board for that meeting;

(vi)If a Member of the Society shall change his address, he may notify to the Secreta his new address but if he fails to notify such address, his address as recorded on the Lin

rolls of the members shall be deemed to be his address.

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A member of the Society or the Board shall cease to be such a member if he (a) dies or (b) resigns his membership or (c) becomes of unsound mind or (d) becomes insolvent or (e) is convicted of a criminal offense involving moral turpitude or (f) if he is removed by the Central Government in consultation with the State Government from the membership of the Society; or (g) if, except in the case of the Director of the Institute and the Deans, he accepts a full-time appointment in the Institute or (h) if he fails to attend three consecutive meetings of the Society or the Board without the leave of the Chairperson.

Provided further that a member, whose membership has ceased under the provisions of this rule, may be re-admitted on such terms and conditions as the Board may decide.

(d) Resignation

(i) The Chairperson of the Society / Board may resign his office by a letter addressed to the Central Government and his resignation shall take effect from the date it is accepted by the Central Government.

(ii) A member of the Society or the Board (other than ex - officio member or a member representing the Central Government and the State Government) may resign office by a letter addressed to the Chairperson and such resignation shall take effect from the date it is accepted by the Chairperson.

(e) Filling in of casual vacancy in the Board

Any casual vacancy in the Board shall be filled by the appointment or nomination of a member by the appropriate authority entitled to make such appointment or nomination in terms of these rules and the member so appointed or nominated to fill such casual vacancy shall hold office for the remainder of the term of the member in whose place he has been appointed or nominated.

6. Power and functions of the Board

The Board shall generally pursue and carry out the objects of the Society as set forth in the MoA and in doing so shall follow and implement the policy directions and guideline soad, laid down by the Government of India. The Board shall exercise all administrative and india financial powers of the Society including those vested or conferred on it by or under any state subject, nevertheless in respect of expenditure, to such limitations as the Central Government, from time to time, impose, subject to the provision of the Memorandum of Association and these Rules and Regulations framed there under, the Board shall have the following powers and functions:-

(1) The Board shall be responsible for the general superintendence, direction and control of the affairs of the Institute and shall have the power to frame, amend or rescind the Rules and Regulations governing the affairs of the Institute to achieve its objects.

(2) Without prejudice to clause (1) above, the Board shall have the following powers namely:-

(a) Take decisions on questions of policy relating to the administration and working the Institute:

(b) To make Rules and Regulations and Bye-laws for the conduct of the affairs of the Institute, to add to, amend or repeal any of them, as the case may be, from time to time;

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(c) To examine and approve the annual budget estimates of the Ganesan

(d) To examine and approve the plan for development of the plan for development of the plan; ATA CONSTITUTES and to Esternity ED sources of finance for implementation of the plan; 200 Ft. Thoraipakkam-Pallavaram Ring Road,

(e) Consider, approve and authorize operation/utilization of the funds of the firstitute, Nadu, India

(f) To establish departments, faculties or schools of studies and initiate programmes or courses of study at the Institute;

(g) To create teaching, non teaching and other academic posts, to determine, by Rules, the number and emoluments of such posts and to define the duties and conditions of service of teachers and other academic staff:

Provided that the Board shall not take action without consideration of the recommendations of the Senate;

- (h) To provide, by the Rules, the qualifications, criteria and processes for appointment to teaching, non teaching and other academic posts in the Institute;
- (i) To retain or employ visiting faculty, professional or technical advisers, consultants in connection with the objects of the Institute and to pay thereof such honorarium, fees or other remuneration as may be thought expedient;
- (j) To fix, fees and other charges for the various courses of study and/or programmes which shall be offered by the Institute;
- (k) appoint Committees or Sub-Committees by whatever name called comprising member(s) of the Council and such experts and officers of the Institute as may be nominated by it for specific tasks for the disposal of any of its business or for tendering advice on any matter pertaining to the administration and management of the Institute;

(I) Institute and award fellowships, scholarships, prizes and models;

- (m) Cooperate and collaborate with other State level, national and/or foreign institutions/institutional organizations in the pursuit of its objectives;
- (n) Acquire by gifts, purchase, exchange, lease/hire property movable or immovable and to construct, improve/alter, demolish or repair buildings, works and constructions as may be necessary or convenient for carrying on the activities of the Institute;
- (o) Deal with any property belonging to or vested in the Institute so as to suit its best interest;
- (p) Negotiate, enter into and make contracts and deeds on behalf of the Institute;
- (q) Delegate such of its powers to the Chairperson and or Director and through them or directly to other members of staff of the Institute or any committee or sub-committees appointed by it as it may consider necessary or desirable;
- (r) Solicit and receive grants, gifts, donations or other contributions from the Central/State Government or from any other source, provided that no benefaction shall be accepted by the Institute which involves conditions or obligations contrary to the objectives of the Institute;
- (s) Exercise such other powers and perform such other duties as may be conferred or imposed upon it by the Rules and Regulations.

(3) In addition to above, the Board shall:-

(i) Develop the Institute Development Plan (IDP) for the Institute. The IDP shall define the long-term goals of the Institute, the issues and challenges facing the Institute and the strategies for dealing with them. It shall set targets for institutional improvement, define key performance indicators, and detail the financial requirement with year-wise break ups.

(ii) Obtain short term, medium term and long term requirement of skilled work force and take steps to produce graduates accordingly.

(iii) Identify education needs of faculty and depute them for training in associated

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industries/ other institutes;

- (iv) Ensure implementation of various activities of the scheme in time bound manner so as to adhere to the time schedule agreed in the IDP;
- (v) Monitor the progress of implementation of the scheme at the institute level and furnish periodical reports to the State Steering Committee (SSC).
- (vi) Set up suitable mechanism to obtain feedback from industry for improvement in delivery:
- (vii) Set up placement cells in the Institute to guide/help the graduates in employment/self employment and develop suitable sustainable mechanism to trace the careers of the graduates for at least three years; and,
- (viii) Furnish periodical reports with respect to the placements to the SSC.
- (4) With the broad objective of improving the quality of education leading to better employability, the Board shall:
- (i) Finalize the Key Performance Indicators (KPIs) as yearly targets for next five years, for improving the internal as well external efficiency of the Institute against the base line information. These parameters shall be used to evaluate the success of the Scheme.
- (ii) The Board shall develop monitoring mechanism to review the performance of the Institute and submit quarterly reports to the SSC.
- (iii) In case of unsatisfactory performance in implementation of the Scheme, including achievement of KPIs, the Board shall submit a detailed report to the SSC within 30 days of receipt of a notice in this regard, inter-alia indicating the reasons for failure and measures required to be taken.
- (5) The Board may, subject to the provisions of Rules and Regulations, through a resolution, delegate the exercise of its powers and discharge of functions to the member/s of the Board, the Senate, the Research Council, a Committee or to the Director or any other officer of the Institution, as the Board may consider necessary or desirable.
- (6) The Board shall conduct an annual review of the performance of the Director with specific reference to his leadership in the context of the achievement of the objects of the Institute.
- (7) The Board shall, in exercise of the powers and discharge of functions, strive, to the extent possible, to provide autonomy in academic matters to the Senate, Research Council and Departments or Faculties or Schools, as the case may be.

(8) Where in the opinion of the Director or the Chairperson, the situation is so emergent that an immediate decision needs to be taken in the interest of the Institute, the Chairperson, on the recommendation of the Director, may issue such orders, as may be necessary, recording the grounds for his opinion:

Provided that such orders shall be submitted for ratification of the Board in the

meeting.

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7. Meetings of the Board of Governors

- (i) The Chairperson shall summon the meetings of the Board which shall ordinarily meet once in every three months. The Chairperson shall decide the date of the meeting, its location and fix the agenda.
- (ii) For every meeting of the Society fifteen days notice shall be given to the members, which may be reduced in exceptional circumstances to up to seven days, with the approval of the Chairperson
- (iii) Every meeting of the Board shall be presided over by the Chairperson and, in his absence from any meeting, by a member chosen from amongst themselves by the members present at the meeting;
- (iv) The Chairperson can call an extraordinary Meeting at a short notice in case of emergency or shall call a meeting of the Board upon a written requisition of not less than one third of the existing members.
- (v) Eight members of the Board including the Chairperson shall constitute a quorum for any meeting of the Board;
- (vi) In case of difference of opinion amongst the members the opinion of the majority shall prevail;
- (vii) Each member of the Board including the Chairperson shall have one vote and if there shall be an equality of votes on any question to be determined by the Board, the Chairperson shall in addition have and exercise a casting vote.
- (viii) A copy of the proceedings of every meeting shall be furnished to the Central Government as soon as practicable after the meeting;
- (ix) Any resolution, except such as may be placed before the meeting of the Board may be adopted by circulation among all its members and any resolution so circulated and adopted by a majority of the members who have signified their approval or disapproval of such resolution shall be as effective and binding as if such resolution had been passed at a meeting of the Board; provided that in every such case at least seven members of the Board shall have recorded their approval of the resolution.
- (x) The Chairperson shall have the power to invite any person or persons, not being members of the Board, to attend the meeting of the Board, but such invitees shall not be entitled to vote at the meeting.

8. Chairperson

(a) Appointment

The Chairperson of the Board of Governors of the Society shall be an eminent person from the fields of Engineering, Science, information Technology of Industry He shall be appointed by the Society from a panel of three names recommended by a Search-cum-Selection Committee which may consist a nominee each of the Central Government, State Government and a nominee of the Industry Partner(s), all of whom shall be persons of eminence in the academia from the fields of Engineering, Science, Information Technology and Industry. The Director of the Institute shall be the convenor of the meetings of the Search-cum-Selection Committee but shall not participate in its deliberations.

The tenure of the Chairperson shall be five years.

(b) Functions and Powers

The Chairperson shall chair meetings of the Board and have a general supervision and control over all the affairs of the Institute. He may take such action in case of an emergency as he may think expedient and inform the Board at the next meeting.

(a) Appointment etc.

(1) The Director shall be the principal executive of the Board and Senate and for the day-to-day administration of the Institute.

(2) The Director shall exercise such other powers and perform such other duties as may be assigned to him under these Rules, by the Board, the Statutes or Ordinances or delegated by the Board or the Senate.

(3)The Director shall be appointed by the Board from a panel of names recommended by a Search-cum-Selection Committee consisting of-

(a) the Chairperson of the Board;

- (b) Director of the Indian Institute of Technology of the zone in which the Institute is located;
- (c) One nominee of the State Government, who shall be persons of eminence in academia in the field of information technology;
- (d) one nominee of the industry partner (s), from the information technology industry
- (4) The Director shall, except on account of resignation or removal, hold office for a term of five years from the date on which he enters upon his office.
- (5) The Director may, by notice in writing under his hand addressed to the Chairperson, resign from office.
- (6) The Director may be removed by the Board on proven charges of misbehaviour or misconduct:

Provided that the Director shall not be removed from his office, except by an order made by the Board after an inquiry instituted in this behalf by the Board, in which the Director has been informed of the charges against him and given a reasonable opportunity of being heard in respect of those charges:

Provided further that where the institution of an inquiry or removal of the Director is being considered by the Board, the Director shall excuse himself from the proceedings of the Board.

- (7) The Board may remove the Director from office, if it is dissatisfied with the functioning of the Institute after review of the affairs of the Institute in the manner provided in subsection (6).
- (8) The Board shall initiate the process of appointment in respect of any vacancy due to arise on the post of Director on completion of tenure before a period of six months from the date of arising of such vacancy:

Provided that the process of appointment shall be completed before such vacancy arises.

(9) Where a vacancy has arisen on the post of Director on account of any reason other than completion of tenure, the process of appointment in respect of such vacancy shall be completed within a period of three months from the date such vacancy had arisen.

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(10) In the event of the post of Director remaining vacant for any reason it shall be open to the Board to authorize any member of the Board of any faculty member of exercise such powers, functions and duties of the Director as the Board of the Director is duly appointed.

(b) Functions and Powers of the Director

Subject to the supervision, superintendence and control of the Board, the Director shall be the principal academic and executive officer of the Institute and shall be responsible for the implementation of the decisions of the Board and Senate and for the day to day management of its activities and overall academic functioning and administration of the Institute. He shall discharge these responsibilities in accordance with the Rules and Regulations and bye-laws of the Institute.

In case of an emergency, the Director may take such action as may be necessary with the approval of the Chairperson and report to the Board, at its next meeting.

It shall be the responsibility of the Director to see that all moneys are expended for the purpose for which they are granted or allotted. He shall be the custodian of the records and such other property of the Institute as the Board may commit to his charge.

Subject to the provisions of these Rules and Regulations, the Director shall, inter-alia exercise the following functions and powers, namely:

- (i) All expenditure within the budget shall be approved and sanctioned by the Director, or a member of the staff to whom he may delegate this power with the approval of the Board, provided that such expenditure does not exceed the limits specified in the byelaws, if any. The Director shall also have the power to make re-appropriation subject to the following conditions:
- -Re-appropriation to augment the provisions under the head 'Salaries and Allowances' shall require the prior consent of the Board;
- -No re-appropriation shall be made from Capital to Revenue Head and vice-versa, without the prior approval of the Board;
- Re-appropriations within the heads of capital expenditure to cover expenditure on a new project not included in the budget shall require the prior consent of the Board;
- (ii) submit the accounts, the budget estimates and other proposals of the Institute to the Board for its consideration;
- (iii) conduct all official correspondence on behalf of the Institute and the Board;
- (iv) convene meetings of the Board with the approval of the Chairperson;
- (v) be responsible for implementation of the resolutions passed by the Board;
- (vi) assign task to the staff members of the Institute, manage the undertaking of tasks and exercise overall control including disciplinary control on staff members;

(vii) appoint committees or sub-committees by whatever name called, of members of the staff to manage such activities he may deem fit and or otherwise authorize any officer of the Institute to appoint such committees;

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- (viii) participate or nominate members of staff to participate in national conferences and in international conferences in the areas of interest to the Institute;

10. Senate

- (a) Composition
- (1) For effectual discharge of its academic functions, the Institute may have a Senate which shall consist of the following persons, namely:-

- (b) heads of all Departments, Centres, Faculties or Schools or Centres, as the case may be, comprising the Institute;
- (c) Deans in charge of academic, research and student affairs in the Institute;
- (d) six members of faculty from amongst the Professors of the Institute to be nominated by the Board;
- (e) three persons of eminence in education to provide an inter-disciplinary understanding to be nominated by the Board;
- (f) three persons of eminence in research in information technology or related fields to be nominated by the Board;
- (g) such other persons to be nominated by the Board on the basis of Statutes to provide representation in such fields of knowledge or technology which are, in its opinion, not adequately represented.
- (2) The term of office of an ex-officio member shall continue so long as he holds the office by virtue of which he is a member.
- (3) The term of office of a member nominated under clauses (d) to (f) of sub-section (1) shall be three years from the date of his nomination.
- (4) A member of the Senate under clauses (d) to (f) of sub—section (1), who fails to attend three consecutive meetings of the Board, shall cease to be a member of the Board.

(b) Powers and functions of the Senate

(1) Subject to the provisions of this Act, the Statutes and the Ordinances, the Sergies shall be the principal academic body of the Institute and shall have the power to enact, amend, modify Ordinances governing academic matters and the affairs and well-being at

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13. Registrar

- (a) The Registrar shall be appointed by a Selection Committee nominated by the Board under the Chairmanship of the Director, in such manner and on such terms and conditions as may be prescribed by the bye-laws;
- (b) The Registrar shall act under the administrative control of the Director and shall:-
- (i) be responsible for the custody of the records and the common seal of the Institute;

14. Functions and Powers of Other Authorities and Officers

The powers and duties of the authorities and officers other than those mentioned in these rules shall be specified by the Board in the Bye-laws framed for the purpose.

15. Remuneration and Allowances

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16. Insurance and Provident Funds

The Institute shall constitute for the benefit of employees, including the Director, in such manner and subject to such conditions as may be prescribed by the Bye-laws, such Insurance, Provident Fund and other employees welfare scheme as it may deem fit.

- (a) The honorary officers, members of the Board, members of Committees, subcommittees, Directors, auditors and other designated staff of the Institute may be indemnified out of the funds of the Institute against any expenses or liability incurred by them in or about the discharge of their respective duties.
- (b) No honorary officer or member of the Board or member of a committee of the Institute or member of sub-committee shall be liable for any act other than his own or for signing any receipt or other document or for doing any other act for the sake of conformity only, or for any loss or expenses which may be occasioned to the Institute, otherwise than as a direct result of his own negligence or willful misconduct.

18. Funds of the Society

(a) The society shall have its own fund consisting of-

(i) Grant provided by the Central and State Governments less the Resources partners, towards the capital and other costs for setting to the Costs (ii) all fees and other charges received by the Institute; Thoraipakkam, Chennal-600 096, Tamil Nadu, India

(iii) all money received by the Institute by way of grants, loans, gifts, donations, benefactions, bequests or transfers:

- (iv) all moneys received by the Institute in any other manner or from any other source;
- (v) rent, interest, dividend or any other income received upon the investment of the funds
- (b) All moneys credited to the Fund shall be deposited in such bank or invested in such manner, as the Board may deem expedient from time to time in the interest of the Institute, provided that it shall be a public sector bank.
- (c) The fund and the property of the society, howsoever derived, shall be applied only towards the attainment of the objects as specified in the Memorandum of Association of the society.
- (d) The funds of the Board Society shall not be utilized for acquiring any stocks, bonds or securities.
- (e) The Central Government shall have the power to issue instructions in respect of utilization of funds of the society.

19. Operation of Bank Account

The bank accounts of the society shall be kept in the name of the society and shall be operated upon by such officers as may be .designated by the Board. The Bank Account shall be operated jointly by two officers. The bank accounts in the name of the Institute shall be in the name of the Indian Institute of Information Technology Guwahati or IIIT Guwahati.

20. Accounts and Audit

(a) The Member Secretary of the Society for the time being and upon appointment of the first Director and thereafter, the Director shall keep or cause to be kept proper accounts on of the receipts and payments, income and expenditure and of the property, assets and liabilities of the Society. The Annual Accounts shall be made up by the end of the financial year.

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- (b) The Annual Accounts of the Board shall be audited by the Comptroller & Auditor General of India or any other authority as may be decided by the Central Government and any expense incurred in connection therewith shall be payable by the Board.
- (c) The accounts of the Institute as audited and certified by the auditors shall be forwarded annually to the Board for approval.

21. Annual Report

The Board shall prepare or cause to prepare and release for every year an Annual Report, in English and in Hindi or any other additional language as required, the working of the Institute in the previous year on or before the expiry of nine months from the close of financial year, and a copy of the same, together with an audited statement of accounts showing the income and expenditure for the previous year shall be submitted to the Central and State Government within that stipulated time.

22. Budget

- (a) The annual budget of the Institute shall be drawn up by the Director. It shall be considered and adopted by the Board with or without modification.
- (b) The budget estimate for every financial year, duly approved by the Board, shall be sent to the Central Government by such date as may be fixed by it, and a copy of the same shall also be sent to the State Government

23. Power to make Bye-Laws

The Board shall whenever necessary frame, amend or repeal bye-laws not inconsistent with these rules for the administration and management of the affairs of the Institute and in particular to provide for the following matter:-

- (i)The preparation of budget estimates, the sanctioning of expenditure, making and execution of the contracts, maintenance of accounts;
- (ii) The classification and procedure for appointment of faculty, officers and staff of the Institute:
- (iii) The terms and tenure of appointment, tenure of deputation of contractual service, salaries and allowance, rules of discipline and other condition of service or the faculty, officers and staff of the Institute;
- (iv) Conduct of business by the Board, Executive Committee, Senate, Research Committee and the committees constituted by it, the powers and functions of such committees and term of office of their membership;
- (v) The tenure of office, salaries and allowances and other conditions of service of the officers, teachers and employees of the Institute;
- (vi) The management of the properties of the Society;
- (vii) The diplomas degrees and other academic distinctions and titles, which may be granted by the institute:
- (viii) The creation of posts of Professors, Heads of Departments, Associate Professors, Assistant Professors, or equivalent academic designations/post, and posts of other teachers, officers and employees of the Institute, and the appointment of persons such posts including the qualifications requisite therefore;
- (ix) Fixation of fees and other charges for courses of study programs and other facilitiesprovided by the institute;
- (x) The manner in which and the conditions subject to which, pension and provident funds may be constituted for the benefit of faculty, officers and other employees of the Institute;

- (xi) The terms and conditions governing fellowships, scholarships, stipends, medals and prizes etc;
- (xii) The qualification of the teaching, non-teaching and other staff and office bearers of the Institute:
- (xiii) The authentication of the orders and decisions of the Council,
- (xiv) Such other matters as may be necessary for the administration of the affairs of the Institute including those, which by these rules are to be or may be prescribed by the byelaws;

24. Books, Certificates and Forms

Minutes shall be made in proper book of all resolutions and proceedings of the Board meetings, meetings of the Executive Committee, Academic Council, Research Committee, Finance Committee, and meetings of all other Committees. Every minutes signed by the Chairperson of the meeting to which it relates or by the Chairperson of subsequent meeting shall be sufficient evidence of the facts therein stated.

25. Seal of the Society and the Institute

The Board shall provide a Seal of the Society and the Institute and also provide for its safe custody and the seal shall never be used except with the authority of the Board previously given. One member of the Board shall sign every instrument to which the seal is affixed and every such instrument shall be countersigned by the Director or some other person appointed by the Board.

26. Acts and Proceedings not to be invalidated by vacancies etc.

No act or proceedings of the Board members or any authority of the Institute or any committee constituted under these Rules, shall be questioned on the ground merely of the existence of any vacancy or defect in the election, nomination or appointment of a person acting as a member thereof or any irregularity in its procedure not affecting the merits of the case.

27. Legal Proceedings

For the purpose of Section of the Societies Registration Act, 1860 the person in whose name the Society or the Institute may sue or be sued shall be the Member-Secretary of the Board, i.e. the Director of the Institute.

28. Annual List

Once in every year, a list shall be filed which shall contain the names, addresses and occupation of the members of the Board entrusted with the management of the affairs of the Institute and other information as required under the Registration of Societies Act, 1860.

29. Alteration of the Rules and Regulations

The Board may alter these rules and regulations by a resolution passed by a majority of not less than two-third of the members present and voting at any meeting of the Board duly convened for the purpose,

Provided that any amendment in Rule 4(a) relating to composition of the Board of Governors shall be made with the prior approval of the Central and State Government and Industry Partner(s).

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30. Alteration or extension of the purpose of the Society

Whenever it shall appear to the Board that any alteration, amendment or extension is required to be made in the purposes of the Institute, or the Institute be amalgamated with any other society, a written or printed report shall be prepared and the Board may convene a special meeting for the consideration thereof according to the Regulations of the Society.

But no such proposition shall be carried into effect unless such report shall have been delivered or sent by post to every member of the Society ten days previous to the special meeting convened by the Governing Board for the consideration thereof, nor unless such proposition shall have been agreed to by the Boards of three fifth's of the Members of the delivered in person or by proxy, and confirmed by the Boards of three fifth's of the Members present at a second special meeting convened by the Governing Board at an interval of one month after the formal meeting."

(Governing Board Defined :- The Governing Board of the Society shall be the governors, council, directors, committee, trustees, or other body to whom by the rules and regulations of the society the management of its affairs is entrusted.)

The alteration, amendment or extension made or amalgamation effected shall be reported to the Registrar and shall be in confirmation with the provisions of the Societies Registration Act, 1860.

31. Power to Review and Hold Enquiries

The Central Government, in consultation with the State Government, may at any time appoint one or more persons to review the work and progress of the Society or the institute and to hold an enquiry into the affairs thereof and to report thereon, in such manner as the Central Government may stipulate. Upon receipt of any such report, the Central Government may take such action and issue such directions as it may consider necessary in respect of any of the matters dealt with in the report regarding the Society or the Institute, as the case may be, and the Society shall be bound to comply with such directions.

In case the Central Government is satisfied that the Society or the institute is not functioning properly, the Central Government shall have, in consultation with the State Government, the power to take over the administration and assets of the society.

32. Dissolution

The Institute shall be dissolved in accordance with the procedure laid down under Societies Registration Act, 1860. If on dissolution of the Institute there shall remain after satisfaction of its tax and liabilities, any property whatsoever the same shall be dealt with in such manner as per the provisions of the Societies Registration Act, 1860 and shall be with the approval of three-fifths majority of the members present at a Special/Annual General Meeting of the Society. However, any resolution to this effect would need society. approval of the Central Government, which shall take a decision in consultation with the State Government.

33. Application of the Act

All the provisions of the Societies Registration Act, 1860 as amended from time to time K. Ganesan
